Health and Safety Representatives (HSRs) A Health and Safety Representative (HSR) is one way for workers to be represented in relation to work health and safety matters. The appointment of HSRs is not mandatory, and a HSR is not obliged to undertake training. An untrained HSR can exercise most powers except for directing that unsafe work cease or issuing provisional improvement notices (PIN).
